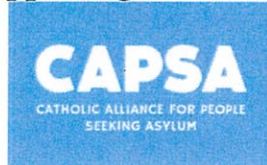

Damien Moloney speak about his experiences
with **displaced people and refugees** and the places they spend their time
before they are relocated around the world.

Damien Moloney started working for Médecin Sans Frontiers (Doctors without Borders) as a logistician in 2008 with his first mission to Mozambique to assist the population that was displaced after the Zambezi River flooded. Since then he has done 16 missions with MSF.
